



FENDT TRANSIT MIX recently completed this new concrete mix plant at Novi, to relieve the overtaxed Farmington plant located on Gill Road. The new plant is just off Novi Road, south of the Grand River intersection. It is a drive through two-stop plant capable of high production, and is a new type semi-automatic scale operation, one of the first such to be installed by Toledo Scale Co. The aggregate is in the left hand bin, the cement in the right. The aggregate storage includes four compartments, holding 400 tons. Cement storage has three com-

partments holding 1,500 barrels of cement. In the dispatching and scale room all operations are performed by pushing buttons on a panel. There is even a moisture meter, with a moisture compensator on the scale. The conveyors are 72 feet above ground, and lead from a drive-over hopper which holds 30 tons of aggregate. The Fendts have had their Farmington transit mix plant since 1951, and long before that operated a block and builders supply. The Novi plant will also serve the Northville, South Lyons, Wixom and Walled Lake territories.
