NEW LUTHERAN Church Buys Site
It was disclosed last week at the morning worship service that Antioch Evangelical Lutheran Church, the new United Lutheran mission congregation being organized in North Farmington, has purchased a three acre lot on the northeast corner of Farmington Road and Thirteenth Mile Road. This site was chosen by Pastor James Henneberger, mission developer for the United Lutheran Church in America, and the seven members of the steering committee of the young congregation. The steering committee acts as a temporary council for the congregation until official organization at which time a Church Council will be elected by the members. The corner of Farmington Road and Thirteenth Mile Road was chosen as the best possible site for the future church building on the basis of a survey that revealed the future growth of the area will someday surround this very important location.

Safety Sunday Set November 17

Sunday, November 17, has been selected for Safety Sunday. On that date, leaders of all religious faiths in Michigan will appeal to their congregations to crusade against speeding fatalities on the state's thoroughfares.

It is the profound conviction of Dr. Stanley Buck, Methodist minister in Port Huron who originated Safety Sunday Observation that the problem of highway safety transcends vital as they are, educational and law enforcement processes. "We feel," he said recently, "that religion of whatever faith, must be put to work to stop the needless and sinful sacrifice of life on the highways. There is need, we believe, to approach the problem from moral, spiritual, and theological viewpoints. The commandment 'Thou Shalt Not Kill' has special significance when we consider rising highway traffic and growing population."

Recently too, John T. Keena of Chicago, Director of the new National Safety Division of the National Safety Council, declared that, "Motorists ought to drive as if God is in the front seat."

Michigan religious leaders are giving their wholehearted support to a safety effort that has, in four years, mushroomed from a southern Michigan local project, to a state-wide crusade through the churches.

New Lutheran Church in City To Hold First Service on Sunday

On Sunday, November 17, the new St. John's American Lutheran Church will hold its first services in the Farmington Junior High school gymnasium.

All citizens of Farmington and the surrounding communities are invited to the Sunday School at 9:15 a.m. and the morning worship service at 10:30 a.m. The Reverend R. H. Schalkhauser, director of Missions for the Michigan District of the American Lutheran Church, will be the speaker.

A full-time pastor will begin directing activities in the new mission congregation in January. Property has been purchased on Hill Road at the west end of Alta Loma Drive. Construction is expected to begin after the first of the year.

St. John's is the newest "package mission" to be established in this area by the American Lutheran Church which has headquarters in Columbus, Ohio.

Under the package mission program, the congregation is loaned sufficient funds by the ALC to purchase property and build a chapel and parsonage. Additional funds are given to pay for transportation expenses during the first few years, until the congregation can completely take over its own responsibilities.
