Spending Won't Buy Scientist, Prof. Warns

A crash program of spending in the field of science is not the answer to America's lag in scientific development, says Dr. Ernest O. Melby, distinguished visiting professor at Michigan State University.

"There are some things we can't buy," declared Dr. Melby, a noted philosopher, author and educator. "We can't buy brains and we can't buy a satellite scientist or physicist. The only way to get a physicist is to start with a child and stick with him... in terms of education." America, he added, has put more emphasis on practical progress than on the theoretical scientist and his brains.

"In our culture we have failed to respect learning," he said.

water was also trucked into the St. Charles, La. area following a flood.

Won't Burn

Wood, which burns when in small pieces, becomes amazingly fire-resistant when glued together in heavy arches or beams or when used in heavy timbers in natural form. An intense heat will buckle and distort exposed steel beams, but only chars over wood. This is especially true of Douglas fir, one of the most widely used structural lumbers.

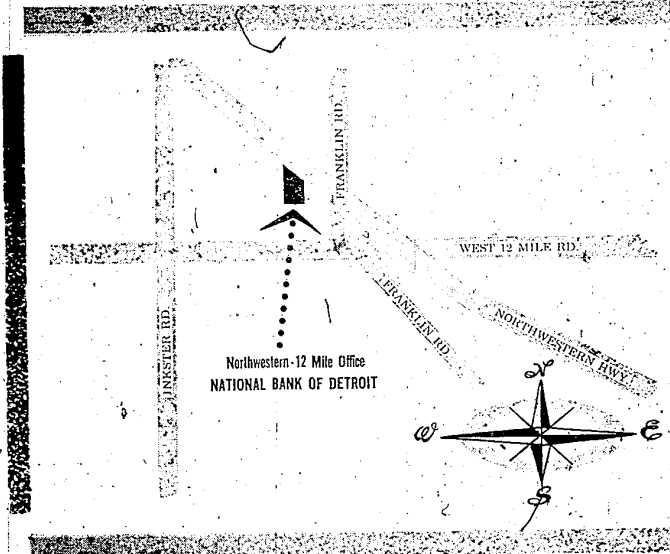
