**What's Happening In Your Township**

**REGISTRATION**  
By law, the registering of electors and the keeping of accurate registration files is the duty of the Township Clerk. While the Clerk is solely responsible for registrations, he may appoint as many deputies or assistants as he feels it necessary to help in taking registrations.

It is not the right of the Township Board, Election Commission or any board to interfere with the Clerk in any way regarding the registrations. The only exception to this rule is that the Township Board does have the right to fix hours, dates and places for taking registrations in cases where the Clerk does not maintain regular office hours.

The Township Board may then designate, not to exceed five dates and places, that the Clerk shall receive registrations. The days designated must be prior to the last date for receiving registrations.

**TIME AND PLACE**  
No person other than the Clerk or persons deputized by him shall take registrations. It is important that all clerks have one or more deputies in order to give the public better service and to act in his absence whenever the need arises.

Clerks must receive registrations at any time their office is open, except during those periods

**STATE AID SHARED TAXES**  
NOTE: Registrations are to be received up to the 30th day immediately preceding an election or primary election, unless the 30th day falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, in which case registrations are to be received on the next working day.

The state sales tax of 3 per cent on each dollar produced three hundred eight million dollars (\$308,000,000.00) in revenue for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1956.

Of this amount one sixth was returned to local units of government and the balance for general operation of state government (after deducting collecting expenses).

In addition more than twenty-one million dollars (\$21,000,000.00) was collected for taxes on intangible property of which nine million five hundred thousand dollars (\$9,500,000.00) was returned to local units of government. During this period, more than sixty-one million dollars (\$61,000,000.00) was returned to local units of government by the use of various formulas of distribution.

The sales tax distribution, which produces the bulk of state shared taxes, is used by many of the townships for general administrative operations.

Although the law covering expenditures of state distributed funds such as sales tax and intangible taxes is rather ambiguous, it can be logically stated that these funds may be used by the township for any service or improvement which by nature is of general benefit to all the inhabitants of the township.

These funds are paid to townships on a per-capita basis based on the last population census which is every ten years. At present we are operating on the 1950 census when the population was 11,200. The present population is approximately 24,000.

**Seek to Repeal Law Giving Youth Scooter Licenses**

Repeal of the provision of the state motor vehicle code permitting the licensing of 14 and 15-year-olds to drive motor scooters will be proposed to the 1958 session of the state legislature by the permanent legislative committee of the Michigan associations of chiefs of police, sheriffs, judges, justices of the peace and prosecutors and the attorney general's department and state police.

Numerous accidents, many of them fatal, have proved that such licensing, authorized in 1950, is dangerous both to the operators of the scooters and others, the committee held. It was pointed out that a youth on a motor scooter is much less safe than driving with the protection of a car, but a license to drive a car cannot be obtained under the age of 16.

The committee voted to also have the following measures reintroduced:

Chemical test of drivers for intoxication.  
Increase the driver's license renewal fee from \$1.50 to \$3, with \$2 of the amount reverting to the respective cities and counties for law enforcement use only. Fifty cents is now returned.

Amendment of the motor vehicle code to provide that an arrest for a second or subsequent violation for driving with a suspended or revoked license or registration which is prosecuted under a local ordinance substantially corresponding to the state law, will have the same effect as would a second arrest for violation of the state law, which would mean a heavier penalty.

The committee endorsed a proposal of the state bar association to amend the disorderly conduct statute to include the prosecution on the lesser offense of persons who could be charged with carrying concealed weapons, a felony, but who are innocent or unintentional violators of the concealed weapons law.

Re-elected as officers of the committee were former Detroit and State Police Commissioner Donald S. Leonard, chairman, and State Police Commissioner Joseph A. Childs, secretary.

consumers and the dairies more than it would help the farmers," said Glenn Lake, MMPA president.

While the organization now opposes the idea of milk marketing controls, its directors will keep track of any new legislation and be ready to alter its position, if needed.

**NEW FACTS** have been uncovered about the danger of drinking drivers.

They were disclosed to the state safety commission by a special committee organized for the purpose by Secretary of State James M. Hare.

The report shows that two bottles of beer or two cocktails within one hour make a driver a menace behind the wheel for one additional hour.

It used surveys developed at Evanston, Ill., and Toronto, Ont., as evidence that the drinking driver is often more dangerous on the highway than the intoxicated motorist.

Now that the evidence is in, what can be done to keep motorists from drinking and driving?

"There must be an educational program that will show them that three drinks can be as dangerous as 13 drinks," said Hare.

**Boys Offered Scholarships**

Scholarships up to \$1500 are now being offered to deserving boys by Cranbrook School, Bloomfield Hills, Michigan.

Any boy may apply for a grant if he is eligible for entrance into grades seven to eleven next September. In addition applicants should meet the following requirements: above average academic record; good school citizen and leader; and a proven need for financial aid.

Cranbrook is a college preparatory school enrolling 380 boys from all over the United States and several foreign countries. It is one of six non-profit institutions that comprise a cultural and educational center just north of Detroit.

All applications for scholarships must be submitted by March 1 to Headmaster, Cranbrook School, Bloomfield Hills, Michigan.

While there is no fixed number or size of grants to be made, a large percentage of Cranbrook students during the school's 30 years, have received financial aid. Under the present scholarship program, grants may be renewed until graduation.
