

| Dash of salt              | maraschino cherries      |
| 2 cups milk               | 1/4 teaspoon rum extract |
| 1 egg yolk                | 1 baked 9-inch pie shell |
| 1 egg white               | Baked pastry cut-out     |
|                           | and pecans               |

Combine pie filling mix, gelatin, salt, and 1/4 cup milk in sauce-  
pan. Add egg yolk and blend well. Add remaining 1-1/2 cups milk.  
Cook and stir over medium heat until mixture comes to a full boil.  
Remove from heat.  
Beat egg white until foamy throughout. Add sugar, a tablespoon  
at a time, and continue beating until meringue will stand in peaks.  
Then fold in hot filling gradually. Chill, stirring occasionally. Whip  
cream and fold with cherries and rum extract into pudding mixture.  
Pour into pie shell. Chill. Decorate top with small baked pastry  
cut-out and circle of pecan halves.

## Broomfield Says Area Trailer Tour Highly Successful

"I gained a lot of first-hand ex-  
perience on the problems facing  
the residents of my district,"  
Congressman William S. Broomfield  
(R-Oakland County) commented  
upon completion of his trailer  
tour through the county earlier  
this month.

During his two month tour in  
his 40-foot rolling office Broom-  
field visited all Oakland County  
cities, villages and townships,  
including Farmington.

From the fruits of his discus-  
sions on the trailer trip, Broom-  
field is now drafting a legislative  
program which he will present to  
Congress next year.

"It's evident that Oakland County  
residents have other things on  
their minds besides the 'Broom-  
field' program," Broomfield said.  
"Almost one-third of those I talked  
with are concerned with the present  
social security system. They main-  
tain that present payments don't  
permit our senior citizens to meet  
their bills for food, clothing, and  
lodging."

Broomfield said he will seek for  
an end to the present \$14.50 limit  
on outside earnings now imposed  
on those receiving social security  
benefits. In addition, he will seek  
a study to see if social security  
payments can be linked to cost-of-  
living index.

Veterans housing was another  
concern of a large number of  
visitors to the trailer. Broom-  
field has to take steps  
to insure that veterans re-  
ceive the houses they paid for.

"The FHA has been doing a good  
job of inspection, but the chunk  
of GI homes isn't what it should be  
in many instances," said Broom-  
field. "I have had numerous com-  
plaints of inferior workmanship  
and inadequate sewage treatment  
and drainage systems."

In addition, Broomfield received  
comments on a large number of  
individual veterans' problems and  
postal problems. "I am happy  
to say we have had almost com-  
plete success in solving these prob-  
lems," he said.
