LIGHTING a special clay lamp from the Holy Land at special ceremonies at the Farmington First Baptist Church recently is observed an unusual ceremony Friday evening, November 8.

Mr. Albert McDonald, 23220 Power Road, a resident here 34 years, honorary life deacon of the church, teacher of the Men's Bible Class, and member of the committee guiding the church in the erection of their new sanctuary, was chosen by the pastor, Dr. Gordon Northrop to be the third person in 2,000 years to light a small clay lamp from the Holy Land.

Before an overflow audience Dr. Northrop announced, "I have selected Mr. McDonald for this privilege not only because of his distinguished service here among us but because he and I are alumni of the same school, the University of Pennsylvania, with mutual interests in archaeology."

Mr. McDonald by profession is an architect, being secretary and treasurer of George D. Mason and Company, Detroit.

The lamp, typical of household lights of that era, was excavated in Hebron by the American Society for Oriental Research. It was brought from Palestine by Dr. Sam Bradford, president of the Denver Baptist Bible College, where local resident, Lewis McLellan, is enrolled as a freshman.

Dr. Bradford, appearing in a week of special services in the local church, chose this olive-oil burning light dating to the time of Christ for a well-pointed object lesson based on the Bible text, Matthew 5:16: "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven."

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
