Northville Comes From Behind To Beat Trojans

A highly unsuccessful football season for the Clarenceville Trojans was concluded last Wednesday when they again fell in defeat, this time at the hands of Northville in a make-up contest.

The unvictorious Trojans gave the powerhouse Northville team a stiff fight in the first half but could not hold off their strength in the second. After trailing 7-6 at the end of the half, the Mustangs showed their real strength and pushed over two touchdowns while holding Clarenceville scoreless. The final score was 20-7.

Winners of the Wayne-Oakland League championship, Northville also placed sixth in the All-Suburban selections this year and 17th in the entire state.

Northville scored first in the game but failed to convert. The Trojans pushed ahead before the half was over when Fred Campbell recovered a Northville fumble and carried it in for the TD. Barry Forsyth ran over for the extra point and the 7-6 lead.

The Mustangs came back from halftime intermission with new power and pushed over both of their tallies. Dick Bigray ran 30 yards for the first counter and made a 20 yard run on the other six-pointer on a 50 yard run.

Using plenty of reserves in the final quarter, Northville contented itself with playing a defensive game and holding the Trojans from scoring.
