Named Regional Chairman for 1938 'Michigan Week'

Paul Carnahan, president of Great Lakes Steel Corporation, has been named chairman of the Southern Region for Michigan Week May 4 to 10, 1938. Announcement of the appointment was made by General Chairman Edward J. Hickman, Hickman Company, Grand Rapids.

The region includes Oakland, Macomb, Washtenaw, Wayne, Monroe Counties, for each of which Mr. Carnahan will name a county chairman.

"With Michigan Week coming just before next year's formal dedication of the Mackinac Straits Bridge, the annual observance will feature a united Michigan with its two peninsulas linked by a great span," Mr. Carnahan said. "The bridge makes the two peninsulas closer physically, economically and culturally. This closer tie will make next year's Michigan Week one of the finest."

He became associated with Great Lakes Steel Corporation in 1933 as a day transfer operator in the blooming mill.

Promotions came rapidly. In 1937 he was superintendent of scanning operations and six years later in the fall he was mill superintendent in charge of production of armor plate and ship plate for defense orders. In 1946 he was named assistant general superintendent of the Bessemer plant, and two years later was director of production. He was named vice president in charge of sales in 1950.

His most important year was 1951 when he was named assistant to the president in February, senior vice president in April and president in May.

Mr. Carnahan is also a member of the board of directors of National Steel Corporation.

He lives at Grosse Ile with his wife, Dorothy, and his daughter, Nancy.

Mr. Carnahan is a member of the Presbyterian National Board of Missions and the Grosse Ile Golf and Country Club.
