**School District to Pay Some Tax on New Sites**

An expenditure of approximately \$467 for taxes on school sites purchased to late to have the property removed from the tax rolls for the current taxable year was approved by the School Board Monday night.

The action came following the expression of an opinion by Robert Kelly, school attorney, that the district was obligated to pay its portion of the total taxes assessed for the year computed from the time of "taking ownership."
