Church to Fete Pastor on 10th Anniversary. The Southfield Community Church, 2122 Indian (near Eight Mile and Jackson), will hold a reception for its Pastor, Raymond Bayne, and his family on Sunday evening, January 26th, following services at 7:30 p.m.

Pastor Bayne came to the Southfield Church in January, 1948 from Warren Park Presbyterian Church of Chicago where he had served as director of music and youth.

During the ten years of his ministry here the church has engaged in three building and alteration programs including the remodeling of the basement in 1948, construction of a 60 x 80' educational building in 1956, and a new ceiling and lighting for the auditorium in 1957. A manse was purchased in 1951.

The growth of the church during those years has been greatly stimulated by the growth of the neighborhood and the constant visitation program of the church and its use of buses to bring in children. Average attendance for the Sunday School has increased from 152 in 1948 to 471 in 1957. Morning Worship has increased from an average of 84 to 245. The evening worship has grown from 52 to 128 and the prayer meeting from 18 to 40.

Vacation Bible School has grown from 42 to 218. Discussion group which was \$1,822 in 1948 to \$22,553 in 1957. A building fund of \$35,836 has been collected in the last two and a half years. Scrapbooks depicting activities of the church during the past ten years will be on display.

Through the years the church has put a strong emphasis on its youth work with its four youth clubs meeting weekly and singing as a combined choir at Sunday. Over 100 youth are to be found in the choir at a Sunday morning service.

The Pastor's family includes three boys, Douglas, David, and Philip.
