was true to tradition in presenting a highlight. The last night party and banquet featured an indoor horse race, complete with mutuels.

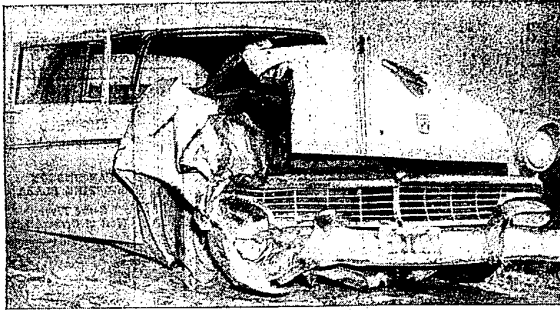
On Monday this week Mary Barden joined her Mercy College dancing group for a trip to Chicago. The performance was held on Tuesday at the Academy of Our Lady.
