GI Loan Home Owners to Get VA Statements

An income tax service for Michigan veterans and others whose "direct" home loans are held by Veterans Administration will be provided by the VA office in Detroit, Michigan.

Mrs. Lloyd H. Jameson, manager, said the office will mail each such borrower a statement of his taxes paid during calendar year 1957, which he may use for income tax purposes if he wishes to itemize his deductions.

The statements will be mailed not later than February 15, 1958, he said. Mrs. Jameson emphasized the statements will be sent only to those veterans whose mortgages are held by the agency under the direct GI loan program, and other borrowers who have purchased properties acquired by VA.

Consumers Plans To Expand Gas Service Here

A new regulator station to reinforce gas supply service in the Farmington Township area will be put under construction this year at Eight Mile and Middlebelt Roads in Livonia, Consumer Power Company officials stated.

Installation of a main along Thirteen Mile Road and mains in Briar Hill and Westbrook 4 subdivisions is also scheduled in 1958.

These projects are part of an \$8 million project planned by Consumers in 1958 to expand and improve natural gas services in the Southeast division, David H. Gerhardt, division manager, stated.

Gerhardt said that Consumers expects to add more than 14,000 new gas customers to its Southeast division lines during the year and that to do so will require the installation of more than 150 miles of new gas distribution mains along with the related gas regulator and transmission equipment.

The Southeast Division encompasses a large region of suburban Detroit communities with headquarters at Royal Oak and district offices in Pontiac, Royal Oak, East Detroit and Plymouth.
