The play takes place in French Guiana at Christmas time in 1910. The three angels are convicts who, while working for the family of Felix Duocet, attempt to solve weighty problems for the unbusinesslike Frenchman and his daughter, Marie Louise. The progress of their attempt makes hilarious action. The comedy is fast-paced with delightful nuances of philosophy on crime and punishment and the audience is guaranteed an evening of good entertainment.
