posed insurance fringe benefit, costing the state approximately \$1,600,000 a year.

The news chronicled finance leaders in the legislature who were faced with a deficit, even before getting the traditional wage increases to meet.

Resort owners heard important news last week from Atty. Gen. Paul A. Adams.

He issued a ruling that regional tourist associations, while not actually a part of state government, could use tax money allocated to them by the State Tourist Council.

This preserved the advertising and promotion program which has placed the state among the top five in the country as tourist playground.

Each of the four regional tourist groups receives \$100,000 a year from the state for promotion and advertising.

Years ago, the legislature approved the plan to allow each of the major resort areas to conduct its own program rather than running the entire system from Lansing.
