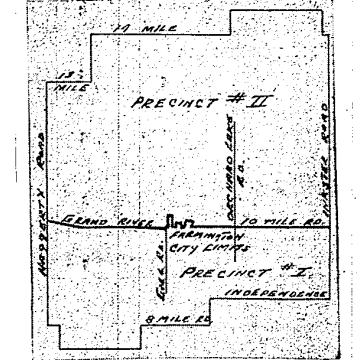

**NOTICE OF DIVISION OF SCHOOL DISTRICT INTO TWO VOTING PRECINCTS FOR SCHOOL ELECTIONS**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION HAS DIVIDED THE FARMINGTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT, OAKLAND AND WAYNE COUNTIES, MICHIGAN, INTO TWO PRECINCTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ALL SCHOOL ELECTIONS:

That the boundary line between Precinct No. 1 and Precinct No. 2 shall be a generally East-West line commencing at the intersection of East-West line commencing at the intersection of Inkster Road and Ten Mile Road, thence Westward along the center line of Ten Mile Road to the intersection of Orchard Lake Road and Ten Mile Road, thence along the present Northernly and Westerly boundary of the City of Farmington to the intersection of Gill Road and Grand River Avenue, thence Westward along the center line of Grand River Avenue to Haggerty Road; and that Precinct No. 1 shall consist of all of the said School District lying South of said boundary line, and Precinct No. 2 shall consist of all the said School District lying North of said boundary line.

That all electors residing in Precinct No. 1 shall vote in the Farmington Junior High School, 33000 Thomas Street, Farmington, Michigan; and all electors residing in Precinct No. 2 shall vote in the O. E. Dunckel Junior High School, 32800 Twelve Mile Road, Farmington Township, Michigan.
