TOWNSHIP BOARD PROCEEDINGS

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington Township Board was called to order on February 11th, A. D. 1958, at 7 P.M. by Mr. Stephen, Chairman. Members present were: Stephen, Cairns, Averys, Fisher and Westlake. Mr. Brown was absent. Mr. Robbins, Township Attorney, also present.

shall keep complete records of all permits issued and inspections performed under the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 5. (A) No alterations or additions to existing wiring, or existing wiring of any dwelling, building or structure, nor shall any dwelling, building or structure be occupied for the placing of any electric lights, motors, heating devices, or any apparatus requiring electrical service, until such time as the wiring has been inspected and approved by the Electrical Inspector.

Section 6. (A) Upon the completion of the installation of any electrical wiring, structure or apparatus, the Electrical Inspector shall inspect the same and issue a certificate of inspection if the same is found to be in compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 7. Upon the completion of the installation of any electrical wiring, structure or apparatus, the Electrical Inspector shall inspect the same and issue a certificate of inspection if the same is found to be in compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 8. The Electrical Inspector shall make periodic, but not less than once in every six months, inspections of all electrical wiring, structure or apparatus installed in dwellings, buildings or structures of any dwelling, building or structure.

Section 9. (A) It shall be unlawful for any person to install, use, or operate any electrical device, apparatus or equipment which is not in compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance.
