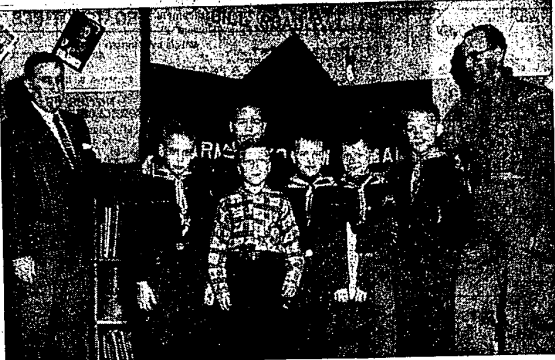

force. Military leaders such as General Mark Clark, General Wedemeyer and others spoken of this force as a mysterious "they" - declaring that it exercised power over the U. S. Government sufficient to bring victory for the Communists in Korea and defeat for the U.S. in Vietnam.

Congress must quickly rebuild a set of internal safeguards against the Communist apparatus. But Congress is not likely to move into this area with sufficient determination unless you and I get busy fulfilling one of the responsibilities of citizenship - writing our Congressmen and Senators and our President, asking them to immediately enact legislation recreating the legal protections for our internal defenses which the Supreme Court has destroyed.

Read These Books

Are you aware of the nature of the Communist enemy in our midst? Are you aware of the way he operates and the power he wields? Herbert Philbrick told me about a friend of his who wasn't. The friend felt there wasn't too much danger in the "small number of Communists in America." One evening recently, Philbrick took the friend a new book entitled "The Pentagon Case." The friend didn't read it at once. But late one night he knocked on Philbrick's door. "I've just finished reading that book," he said soberly. "I'm frightened. I want to talk to you about this thing."

"The Pentagon Case" was written by Col. Victor J. Fox. The publisher is Colonial Press, Clinton, Massachusetts. Every American should read it. Another disturbing book is "No Wonder We Are Losing" by Robert Morris. This book is obtained from The Book-mailer, Box 101, Murray Hill Station, New York 16, New York. Read them and then ask your Congressman to do something about the situation they describe. Our people have the intelligence and are plenty able to win the worldwide fight with Communism but we must get busy now repairing the breaks in our internal defenses.

Takes Part in Army Maneuver in Germany

Pvt. Kenneth F. Pike, 38, son of Mrs. Sara F. Pike, 1555 W. Woodring, Livonia, recently participated in "Sabre Hawk," a Seventh Army maneuver which involved more than 100,000 troops in Germany.

The maneuver, designed to test the combat readiness of Seventh Army units, was the largest winter exercise ever held in Germany.

Nearly 2,500 New Homes Built

According to recent figures released by the Detroit Regional Planning Commission, nearly 2,500 new homes were built in Farmington during the period from 1950 through 1957.

The exact total was set at 2,450 for the eight year period. Of this total, 1,359 new homes were constructed in the township and 891 in the city.

The heaviest building year in the city was in 1954 when 437 new homes were started or nearly half of the total for the entire period.

The greatest amount of building activity in the township was recorded in 1955 and '56 when 667 and 641 new homes, respectively, were started.

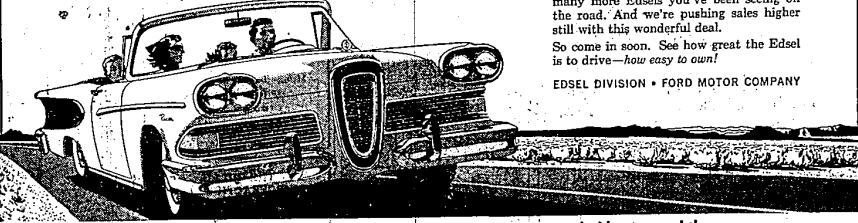
