**Offer Classes For Expectant Parents in Area**

How many diapers shall I buy? What does it mean when the mother is Rh negative and the father Rh positive? How do you know when a baby is hungry? He cries for every thing, doesn't he? Questions like these are commonly raised in classes for expectant parents. The classes are conducted by public health nurses and are sponsored by the Oakland County Medical Society, the Oakland County Department of Health and various Adult Education Departments.

Expectant Parents' Classes offer an opportunity for parents to gain insight into the problems that will help to increase their enjoyment in this experience and will prepare them to give care when baby arrives. The first four classes are centered around the mother. There is ample opportunity for discussion of family adjustments, growth and development of the baby before birth and labor and delivery. The last four classes will cover feeding of the baby, what the new baby is like and baby's first year.

Audio visual aids are used to supplement discussion and conducted hospital tours are arranged during classes.

Class and registration will be held at the Oakland County Dept. of Health offices in the following areas:

**Oakland County Easter Seal Sale Goal \$40,000**

"The 1958 Easter Seal appeal in behalf of crippled children in Oakland County opens Thursday, March 8, and continues through Easter Sunday, April 6. A \$40,000 goal has been set for the campaign," Matthew Cammareri, Easter Seal Chairman for the Oakland County Society for Crippled Children, announced today.

"The \$40,000 goal was based on the Society's current operating budget. Oakland County's crippled children depend upon the generosity of Easter Seal contributors to bring them care, treatment and other services. In 1958 more is needed to continue professional help from physical therapists, speech teachers, and for crutches, wheel chairs, braces, and training equipment for our afflicted children, and to make possible growth and expansion to meet the demands of increasing numbers of handicapped children.

"Here in Oakland County contributions will be used to meet outstanding needs for professional services to the crippled at the Oakland County Society For Crippled Children's home on West Lawrence Street in Pontiac and later in their new home on Telegraph Road near the County Center.

"Approximately 90 per cent of the funds raised in Michigan during the Annual Easter Seal campaign finances services for crippled children and adults in the state," added Cammareri, "The remainder goes to help support a national program of service, education, and research.
