With the thermometer registering zero and a sharp wind blowing, the church broke ground with the audience singing "The Church's One Foundation."

The A. J. Anderson Company, general contractors, are in charge of the construction of the new sanctuary and Sunday School facilities, which will house not only a complete suite of executive offices, but will assist in providing for a Sunday School of 200 and a congregation of 600 at one worship service.
