Grand River To Be Expressway

Repeated proposals to make Grand River Avenue into an expressway may soon blossom into a reality. It is now part of the state highway Detroit to Muskegon expressway plan, and Commissioner John Mackie had already told plans to complete Grand River from Farmington into the city as the eastern terminus.

ONE MILLION dollars for this purpose has been included in a working contract amendments regarding the extension of the expressway between the state, Wayne County and Detroit, primarily a 300 million dollar construction of four other Detroit area expressways.

The 300-million is for the Southfield, Farmington, and Chrysler expressways, and the northern extension of the Lodge expressway from Wyandotte to the city limits. After final approval by the Common Council, the Wayne County Board of Supervisors and the State Administrative Board, the federal government will bear 90 per cent of the Detroit-Muskegon route.

oluh Star Bulletin," the backing of the state does not mean that a person will be elected or a measure passed. The extent of their political power is indicated, however, in the case of Democrat John A. Burns, Territorial Delegate to the United States Congress. According to the public record he was endorsed and backed by the ILWU. Recently he posed at a union banquet with Harry Bridges and Jack Hall. Mr. Burns credited the ILWU with the Democratic victory in the last election in Hawaii, and expressed the wish of many other Democratic leaders.

Supreme Court decisions have crippled our defenses against internal Communism. There is no doubt about that. All of us need to request of our Congressmen that they consider legislative proposals to be immediately erected—giving our Government the legal tools with which it can adequately cope with the Communist menace. We must actively to weaken our defenses and destroy us. Even more important is the need for every American to clearly understand the nature of the enemy within. See next week's column.
