Small Production All the Government's farm census of 1954 listed 4,783,018 farms. Only 44 per cent—2,101,839—have market sales totaling as much as \$2,500 a year. Yet they produce more than 90.8 of all farm products for market. The less productive farms—2,681,179, or 56 per cent—produce only 9.2 per cent of total farm production measured by dollar value.

But what about this 56 per cent of all farms which sell from \$100 to \$2,500 worth of products a year? The number of these "subsistence" farms decreased by 20 per cent in the four year period preceding the 1954 farm census. These farm families voluntarily moved into urban areas and found better paying occupations. The CED suggests that a plan to speed this transition must be a major part of any workable program designed to give the farm program.

But what about this 56 per cent of all farms which sell from \$100 to \$2,500 worth of products a year? The number of these "subsistence" farms decreased by 20 per cent in the four year period preceding the 1954 farm census. These farm families voluntarily moved into urban areas and found better paying occupations.
