Some legislators feel that expansion of college programs has not always been in the most important areas. They have criticized some extension programs and night courses. But educators remind that adult education courses are designed to pay for themselves; that federal monies pay up to 40 per cent of the cost of extension programs. They point out that these activities are pursued to help meet the complex needs of a complex society.

No matter who looks at it, the problem boils down to the old question faced by lawmakers: Shall the expenditure be made to properly fill the need, or shall we do the best we can with the funds available, without increasing the tax load?

Education is just one of many identical problems with the dollar shortage.

The state needs money to complete construction of prisons, to meet the needs of Boys Vocational School, to expand mental health facilities and fit the functions of all agencies to the age.

Finance experts in the legislature are poking through every function of government to find extra money.

The Conlin Plan, authored by Rep. Holo G. Conlin (R-Tipton) to extend the 30-day payment of the state's liquor bills to a 90-day credit period has been signed into law. This maneuver is expected to bring in \$2,000,000 by May and a total of \$15,000,000 by August.

Another \$50,000 has been requested from the World War II and Korean veterans bonus fund.

The struggle to handle the state's financial problem will continue, probably until the first day of the legislative session. Plans to adjourn in mid April may have to be changed. Whatever the decision regarding this year's program, it will be made only after numerous near-irresistible forces have reckoned with numerous near-immovable objects.
