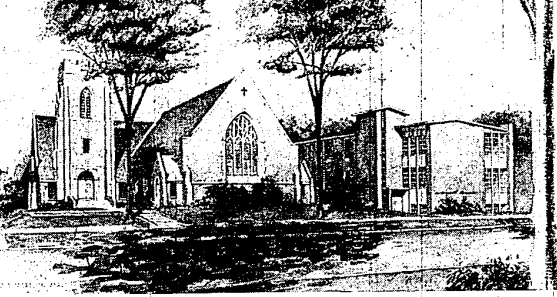

First Methodist Educational Unit Consecration Set
 The First Methodist Church of Farmington will hold a Consecration Service on this Sunday, April 13th, at 7:30 in the evening for the new educational unit of the church shown to the right of the church in the architect's drawing above. The guest speaker will be Bishop Marshall Reed, bishop of the Methodist Church for the state of Michigan. Bishop Reed will speak and also take part in the service of consecration.
 The four choirs of the church will also take part in the service. The Chancel Choir, under the direction of Clarence Juhaz, will sing "The Gloria" by Mozart. The Church Choir will sing "My Father's House" by Pullen and the combined Coral and Wesley Choirs will render "Bless This House" by Brahms. The soloists are under the leadership of Mrs. William Morgan.
 The building is a lasting memorial of the many members and friends who have labored and sacrificed to make an ideal and goal a reality. The building has been approximately 3 years in the planning stage and it has taken nine months to complete the actual building. Reverend Russell Sarsaw, minister, said.
 Included in the educational unit are 18 classrooms, including three assembly rooms, a church office, minister's study and Church School offices. The existing kitchen has also been greatly enlarged and attendance each Sunday so that already the facilities are almost taxed to capacity. Rev. Sarsaw commented, "We would like to express our sincere thanks at this time to the many well-wishers and friends who have rejoiced with us in this milestone in the annals of the history of the Methodist Church in Farmington."
