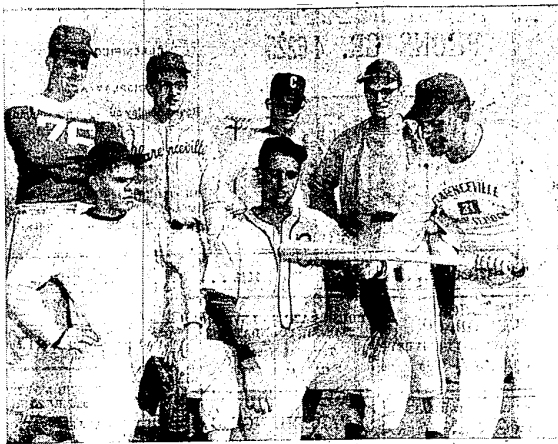

N'western YMCA Plans Summer Camp Program

Representatives of the six schools in the league voted to have all basketball games next year officiated by three officials instead of the customary two.

"Actually this isn't the first time this has been tried," Farmington High Athletic Director Jack Cotton stated. "I think both Redford Union and Van Dyke coaches have used this system before."

With three officials, the chances of one being caught out of position and forced to make blind calls will be reduced. With the three official plan, one official would be assigned to each end of the court with the third facing the scorer's table near center court.

"As soon as you mention three officials," Cotton continued, "people tell you there will be more whistle blowing. I don't think so. The kids on the floor will be more aware of the officials' for one thing. In game trials before there were no more fouls called."

The three-official setup will be in use at all home games in which Inter-Lakes League teams play. Other member teams, besides Farmington, are Southfield, Berkeley, VanDyke, Walled Lake and Waterford.
