

Wayne, Oakland, Macomb Educate Nearly 50% of State's Children

Contrary to popular belief, there exists in Michigan a situation which finds a few 12-grade school districts faced with the problem of educating a major portion of our students. Three counties — Macomb, Oakland and Wayne — have 76 of the 539 12-grade districts within their boundaries.

A State Department of Public Instruction study shows that although this represents only 14.1 per cent of the 12-grade district total, these districts enroll 42.8 per cent of the pupils in all 12-grade districts.

On November 1, 1957, there were 2,672 school districts in the State. Based on 1957 school year data, these districts had an enrollment of 1,451,832 pupils. Yet only 20 per cent (K-12) of the total school districts enroll 1,235,874 pupils, or 85.3 per cent of the total public school enrollment.

Propose Bill to Permit Stopping Unwanted Mail

Residents who don't want "junk mail" won't have to receive it under a plan proposed by two Michigan Congressmen.

Representatives S. Broomfield (R-Oakland County) and Robert J. McIntosh (R-Port Huron) have introduced a bill to stop delivery of all third class mail to those households which request such service.

"We have received a great number of complaints from residents in our districts who object to receiving unsolicited mail," said Broomfield. "So we are proposing that those who don't want such mail can fill out a form at their local post office to discontinue delivery of all third class mail at these homes."

The measure would help not only the householder, but the direct mail advertiser as well, said McIntosh. "The direct mail advertiser knows that a large percentage of his mail is going to be thrown away unopened," he said. "By eliminating those who don't want such mail, he will save himself some money by printing only enough of his brochures and form letters to cover those who actually are interested in such mail."

In addition, the measure should take some harassed postmen off the hook. "A mailman is subject to fine or imprisonment or both if he doesn't deliver the mail," said Broomfield. "It doesn't make any difference whether the piece of mail is an important letter or an advertising pamphlet."

Some housewives have let it be known in no uncertain terms that they don't want any of these direct mail advertising letters delivered to their homes," said Broomfield. "But the law says the postman must deliver these letters whether the family wants them or not."

Both Broomfield and McIntosh emphasized that their proposal would be "all or nothing" in the delivery of the class mail. "It would be impossible for the Post Office Department to differentiate between various types of third class mail," said McIntosh. "We would like to eliminate the good with the bad in this type of mail."
