New Growth At Schoolcraft

Schoolcraft College will house a larger number of students in expanded facilities when classes begin Aug. 23 than at the beginning of the last school year.

Edward McNally, vice president for student affairs, reported 4,575 applicants had been accepted as of Aug. 15 compared with 2,264 at the same time last year. Applications as of Aug. 15 numbered 2,864 as against 2,865 for the same date in 1972.

The board of trustees, at a study session Wednesday, also was notified that additions to both the Applied Science and Liberal Arts buildings will be ready for full use by start of the fall semester.

The Applied Science addition was "unofficially occupied" Aug. 1, a spokesman said, with "only a few minor things to be cleared up" at that time.

Workers have begun moving furniture into the Liberal Arts addition which was termed "substantially completed" and "ready for occupancy by next week."

The board also was told that an engineering firm has been hired to survey heating and ventilating problems in the main part of the Applied Science Building.

Heating and ventilating work in the original Liberal Arts Building is nearly completed, and engineers are evaluating similar work needed at Waterman Campus Center. The evaluation is expected to take six to eight weeks.

The first phase of a water improvement project is under way with a new meter pit under construction.

The board heard a recommendation from W. Kenneth Lindner, vice president for administrative affairs, for consolidation of banking accounts.

As the college has grown, Lindner explained, funds have been disbursed into 19 separate accounts at three different banks.

He recommended consolidation to seven accounts to facilitate handling of the 1,500 to 1,700 checks written by the college monthly.

The board took the recommendation under advisement.

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Orchard Ridge Accepts Students

Persons who missed the 1973 fall session mail registration at the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College will still be able to register Sept. 4-6, according to an alphabetical schedule by last name.

Don Demko, counseling department chairman said, "Students who have need of counseling assistance in selecting the courses of their choice before registration should come to the counseling center in M Building. Counselors are willing to help on a first come, first served schedule after Aug. 15, from 9 a.m. thru 8 p.m. daily."

Larry Soldan of the Orchard Ridge office of admissions added, "If you have never applied to OCC before and wish to attend this fall, we are still accepting new applicants." Students are advised to call the campus in Farmington Hills for additional information regarding admissions procedures.

The review, with classes in the evenings and on Saturdays, prepares enrollees for the CPA examination scheduled for Nov. 7-9. Courses offered are Practice I (regulations, tax, fund accounting), Practice II (all other areas of practice), theory, law auditing, and economics.

Candidates completing the program have been very successful in passing the examination.

Louis Glazier of Farmington, who enrolled in three of Oakland's CPA review courses last fall, won the Paton award given by the Michigan Association of CPAs.
