Mary Mohasci, Livonia who teaches physical education in Clarenceville elementary schools, is going to participate in the "Olympics of bowling."
This mother of three, an enthusiastic bowler for 25 years and rated one of the best woman leggers in Michigan, has qualified for February competition in Bogota, Colombia.
The meet is sponsored by the Federation Internationale des Quilleurs.
"It's generally called the Olympics of bowling," Mrs.

Mohasci said, "because it draws people from many different countries."
This year's meet is for bowlers in the western hemisphere. Another will be held for Europe and Asia. Every four years there is a world competition, with the next one coming up in London in 1975.
Mrs. Mohasci's qualifying for the FIQ meet began in May when she joined a team of leading bowlers from the Detroit area for the Women's International Bowling Congress tournament in Las Vegas.

"It was what we call a makeup team," she explained. "The members were not members of any of the big teams that go to the tournaments, but we got together for the WIBC competition."
Placing 12th in all-events, she qualified to go on to the U.S. team trials in Milwaukee the last week of July. There she placed third, good enough for a place on the team of six women and nine men that will journey to Bogota.
Mary Mohasci began bowling as a child, when her parents took her regularly to join them at alleys on the east side of Detroit.
Later, while a student at Wayne State University, she decided she wanted to "do some serious bowling" and worked for a while with Clarence Hoffman, former owner of Livonia Lanes.
She bowled for about a dozen years in the Detroit area's "major leagues" as the top teams in the area are known.
That was while she was teaching physical education at Cody High School and later,

er, after her marriage to Ted Mohasci and the arrival of Mark, now 13, Sandi, 12, and Cindy, seven.
But being with the majors meant a great deal of weekend travel for tournament play. Mrs. Mohasci said, so things changed a bit after she started teaching in Clarenceville.
"For me it was too much to work all day and keep up with the children and keep up all that travel," she explained.
Now she bowls in two Observer area leagues. She's president of the Merri-bowl Doubles, a women's league, and she belongs to one of the two women's teams in the otherwise - all male Wayne Classic League.
"My husband belongs to one of the other teams and sometimes we bowl against each other," she said.
Bowling is a family sport for the Mohascis. They frequently get together for a game and Ted and Mark are members of a father - son league at Merri-bowl.
Her husband enjoys the game, Mrs. Mohasci said, "but he worries more about my bowling than his own."
He and the rest of the family don't mind just a little bragging about Mom's average - 190 in the men's league and 186 at Merri-bowl.

The rest of the family sports respectable averages too. Ted's is 175, Mark's 146 and Sandi's 144. Sandi also swims regularly with the Livonia Bulldogs team.
The best game Mrs. Mohasci ever had was a 279 - "and I've made that quite a few times."
"I got those eight strikes in a row and then I fall apart," she said. Her highest three-game total is 742.
Looking forward to the February tournament, Mrs. Mohasci is hoping it will work out as a family trip. "It's some place you don't exactly go every day," she said, "so I hope we can all go."
She will meet in Miami for three days for practice with the other U.S. team members. "We don't know yet who will be bowling in which events," she said. "That will be worked out then."
She has the assurance of the Clarenceville school district that she'll get time away from her classes at the Edgewood and Westbrook schools.
My principal, David Kamish, wrote a letter to the Board of Education," she said, "and they said they felt this was an honor and I should be given the time off."
