Edible Wild Plants Theme Of Workshop

Almost everyone knows many wild plants can be eaten, but which ones and how to prepare them are not so well known. Cranbrook Institute of Science's new workshop "Edible and Natural Uses of Wild Plants" will explain it all.

The workshop for beginners will meet from 9 a.m. to noon Sept. 8, 15, 22, 29 and Oct. 6 in the institute botany classroom, 500 Lone Pine Road. It will be instructed by Dr. James Wells, institute botanist, and Susan Smith and Rebecca Radcliffe.

The workshop will explore various uses of local wild plants, including identification of edible plants, cooking methods and preparation of natural dyes. Also included will be a basic introduction to botany, three field trips on the Cranbrook grounds and a session using plant pigments to dye wool.
