Cable TV, Nature Camp Pondered

The future of cable television in the Farmington area will be the subject of discussion for committees made up of school board members and administrators from the Clarenceville and Farmington School Districts.

The Clarenceville Board of Education recently moved to accept Farmington school board President Mervyn Ross's recommendation for a joint meeting to discuss the subject. A date for the meeting has not yet been set.

According to Ross, the City of Farmington has already been approached by a law firm regarding the future development of cable television.

Farmington School Supt. Marinus VanAmejde said 40 per cent of cable TV time should be devoted to educational uses and 60 per cent to public use.

According to VanAmejde, it is required by state law that one per cent be devoted to educational uses. He said the Federal Communications Commission has set aside a channel for educational purposes.

Cable television in the schools would allow educational meetings, such as school board meetings, to be broadcast.

Cable television must also be maintained by franchise, which is usually offered in 20 to 30 year periods. It is not yet clear how such a franchise would affect school systems.

The Clarenceville school board has also appointed a committee to study the possibility of joining four other school districts in the purchase of a 70-acre parcel of land to be used for an environmental study camp.

The project was initiated by the Novi School District and tentatively includes Clarenceville, Farmington, North Lyon and Huron Valley.

The land, located near Hamburg in Livingston County, is owned by a Pinckney resident and is being handled by Walker McKinlay Associates of Bloomfield Hills.

The asking price is \$10,000 with \$29,000 down and the balance payable in five years at seven per cent interest.

The property reportedly has everything from high meadows to swamps, two lakes, a stream and some buildings. It was formerly used as a church camp.

School Calendar Set At C'ville

The 1973-74 school year for the Clarenceville School District has been announced.

Teachers will report for orientation on Tuesday, Sept. 4, with the first day of school on Wednesday, Sept. 5.

Thanksgiving vacation is Nov. 22 and 23 with students reporting back to classes on Monday, Nov. 26.

Winter vacation begins Monday, Dec. 24 and students go back to classes on Thursday, January 3.

End of the semester falls on Jan. 25. Spring vacation is from April 12 through April 21. There will be no classes on Monday, May 27, which is Memorial Day.

The last day of classes is Thursday, June 13, with records day on Friday, June 14.

Junior High Orientation Set

Clarenceville School District students who will enter the seventh grade this fall are being asked to attend an orientation session with school administrators and counselors the week of Aug. 27.

Those enrolling from Edgewood School are asked to meet Monday, Aug. 27, at 10 a.m. in the junior high building.

Seventh graders from Botsford school are to meet at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 28, in the junior high; Grandview students on Wednesday, Aug. 29, at 10 a.m.; and Westbrook students on Thursday, Aug. 30, at 10 a.m.

Students must provide their own transportation for the sessions, all of which will be dismissed at 11 a.m.

The first day of school on Wednesday, Sept. 5, all junior high students are to report at 9:10 a.m. with seventh graders going to the gymnasium, bleachers and eighth graders to the cafeteria.

School hours for the 1973-74 school year are from 9:10 a.m. until 3:34 p.m.

Seventh grade students new to the district are asked to present physical examination forms at the opening of school. Physical examination forms are available at the junior high office. Students interested in participating in sports should obtain physical examination cards from the junior high office.

Clarenceville school district officials are requesting that parents of kindergartners register their youngsters immediately at any of the four elementary schools - Edgewood, Westbrook, Grandview and Botsford.

A child entering Michigan schools for the first time must have a complete physical examination, including the law-required immunizations and a vision test. Medical forms are available in the elementary buildings.

Clarenceville elementary offices are open each week day from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m.

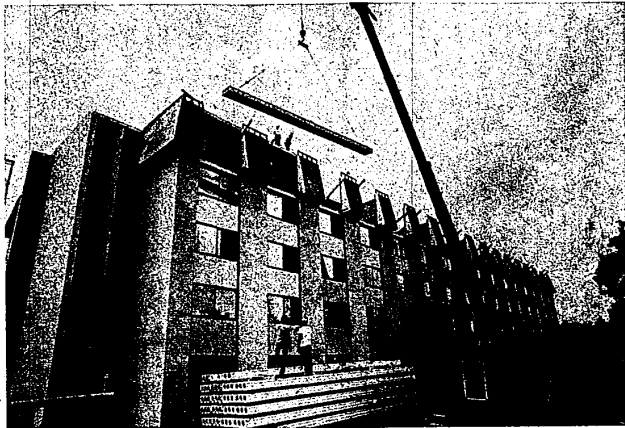

Course Set In Farmington

Oakland University will inaugurate a program of real estate education in Farmington next month.

G. Gordon Walker, director of real estate education at Oakland, announced Real Estate I leading to a GR (Graduate Real Estate Institute) designation will be offered beginning Monday, Sept. 17 at Farmington High School, 32000 Shiawassee.

Courses in real estate law and real estate finance will be conducted on Tuesday and Wednesday nights beginning the same week. Each class will run from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. one night a week for 10 weeks.

Walker said the courses will be taught by professionals from the field of real estate brokerage, marketing, appraising, law and finance. The program should be useful to laymen who wish to increase their knowledge of the real estate field, to those planning to take state brokerage or sales licensing examinations, as well as to those already working in the profession.
