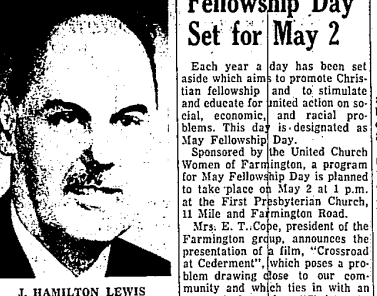

Christian Science Lecture Slated

The practical power of prayer will be the topic of a free public lecture on Christian Science to be given in Farmington on May 2 by J. Hamilton Lewis of Concord, N. H.

Member of the Christian Science Board of Lectureship, Mr. Lewis is currently on nationwide speaking tour. He will speak in First Church of Christ, Scientist at 8 p.m. under the auspices of First Church of Christ, Scientist, Farmington. His subject will be Christian Science Brings Freedom From Pain.

Prior to entering the public practice of Christian Science healing in 1937, Mr. Lewis was active for a number of years as public relations officer and campaign manager for Community Chests, Chambers of Commerce, Boy Scouts of America, and youth organizations throughout New England. He has served for four years as Christian Science Committee on Publication for the State of New Hampshire.

Salem Church Name Changed

The Salem Church, located on Oakland Avenue since 1902, is now acquainting itself with another new name—Salem United Church of Christ.

The congregation was established in Farmington in 1876 as the Evangelical-Salem Gemeinde (Salem Evangelical Community). Since the denomination, in which Salem Church is a part, was established in this country in 1840 as the Evangelical Verein (Evangelical Society), it has experienced four changes in name. Two of which were due to unions with other denominations. From the "Evangelical Verein" the name became "The German Evangelical Church of North America." Next, because of language barrier, the word "German" was dropped.

In 1934 the Evangelical Church of North America and the Reformed Church in the United States united to become the United Church of Christ and Reformed Church. In 1957 the Evangelical and Reformed Church and the Congregational Church joined to form the United Church of Christ.

What's in a name? Many things. For one thing, in the case of the United Church of Christ, two denominations with individual memberships of 1,500,000 and 800,000 became one denomination with a total membership of 2,300,000. This became a great deal in Church program and outreach. In the United States the United Church of Christ has 44 Colleges and 18 seminaries; 18 foreign countries the Church has 218 primary, secondary and schools of higher learning. There are 14 church controlled hospitals; 11 homes for children; 19 homes for the aged; 2 Homes for epileptic; 15 city missions; and probably more than the exact number of the National Mission Projects, there are so many.

Name Selected For New Church

The new Lutheran mission of the Missouri Synod in the North Farmington area has selected the name Prince of Peace Lutheran Church.

On Sunday April 13 in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Wilbert Abram, 2809 Thorney Lane, the prospective members of the church cast six ballots before deciding unanimously on this name.

Prince of Peace Church holds regular Sunday services at 10:30 a.m. in the new Wooddale Elementary School at the end of Peppermill Road, according to the Rev. Carl E. Mehl, pastor. There is a nursery during services.

The first service was held on the Sunday before Easter. Sunday School classes will begin as soon as the material arrives and the teachers have had their first meeting with the pastor.

The church is under the sponsorship of the Michigan District Mission Board, local representatives of the national body, the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, which numbers over 2,000,000 members.

The Board voted recently to engage an architect and proceed immediately with a building program. Prince of Peace Lutheran Church has approximately three acres of property next to the O. D. Dunkle Junior High School on Twelve Mile Road.

A resident of Berkeley, Dr. Menter heads the 156 congregations of the Michigan District of the A.L.C., a body of 2100 congregations and 950,000 baptized members. Pastor E. H. Schalkhaas, Director of Missions for the Michigan District, will serve as liturgical for the service.

The Rev. Donald R. Good, pastor of St. John's, has announced that the new congregation will organize with approximately 70 confirmed and 110 baptized members. With the signing of the constitution, these new members will become charter members of the congregation. Services were begun last November, and Pastor Good was called as the first full-time pastor. He began work in Farmington January 1.

The congregation owns five acres of property on Gill Road south of Grand River. The parsonage has been built and completed. Construction on the first unit of the church building will begin next week. Church services are being held temporarily in the auditorium of Farmington Junior High School at 10:30 a.m., with Church School at 9:15 a.m.

At the organization service next Sunday, special music will be provided by the choir of Truth Lutheran Church of Detroit, and the youth choir of Christ Memorial Lutheran Church of Detroit. A reception will follow the service, which everyone is invited to attend.
