(Continued from Page 1A) There is considerable complaint throughout the township regarding the increasing number of dogs running loose and unimproved. The township has instituted the office of dog warden on a very limited scale (three months of the year).

Establishment of speed limits in rural areas was favored by 66 percent, and 83 percent would be interested in more information as to whether the township could obtain and legally operate road equipment and obtain better roads. Only 28 percent of those answering make use of the township monthly rubbish pickup service, but 64 percent would like a study on improvement of the service.
