NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

CLARENCEVILLE SCHOOL DISTRICT OF OAKLAND AND WAYNE COUNTIES, MICHIGAN

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a special election of the qualified electors of the aforesaid School District will be held in the CLARENCEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL, located at 20210 Middlebelt Road in said School District on Monday, May 12, 1958, and at such special election the following proposition will be submitted to the qualified electors of the School District.

PROPOSITION 1: BONDING PROPOSITION

Shall Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) and issue its bonds therefor, for the purpose of paying the cost of erecting new school buildings and additions to existing buildings, of furnishing the same, and of making improvements to existing school sites?

The polls of election will be open from 7:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. Eastern Standard Time.

Each person voting on the proposition to borrow money and to issue bonds must be a citizen of the United States, above the age of twenty-one (21) years and have resided in the State of Michigan six (6) months and in the School District thirty (30) days next preceding the day of election, and must be the owner of property assessed for taxes within the School District, or the lawful husband or wife of such owner.

Only registered voters are eligible to vote.

TAKE NOTICE that the Board of Education has estimated that Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) is the amount of money necessary to be borrowed for the purposes above mentioned, all of which it is necessary to borrow by means of said bond issue.
