Recovery Inc. Group Forming

Recovery, Inc., an association composed of exceptional nervous and former mental patients, announced this week the establishment of a new group in Farmington.

Meetings will be held every Tuesday evening at 8 p.m. at the First Presbyterian Church at 26165 Farmington Road (at 11 Mile). The leader is a former patient who has been trained in the Recovery panel technique, officials commented.

Recovery, Inc., is a non-profit organization and was founded in 1937 by the late Dr. Abraham A. Low, associate professor at the University of Illinois Medical School. It is a nation-wide organization with several hundred groups in 28 states.

The headquarters is located at 116 S. Michigan Avenue, Chicago 3, Illinois.

A lay organization Recovery does not offer medical advice or in any way supplant the physician. Recovery's self-help method of aftercare was developed by Dr. Low for the purpose of preventing relapses in former mental patients and chronicity in nervous patients. The method is based on Dr. Low's book "Mental Health Through Will."
