ROBERT WEBER

**Named Head of
Highway Safety
Comm. in State**

The Michigan Inter-Industry Highway Safety Committee recently announced the election of Robert W. Weber, Michigan manager of the Allstate Insurance Company, as chairman of the board of directors.

Weber resides with his wife and two children at 7411 Briarcliff Knoll in Franklin Knolls. Chief purpose of the committee is to teach Michigan youths to learn driving by assisting high school driver education. The work is financed by Michigan automobile manufacturers, car dealers and insurance firms.
Last year, the dealers provided 953 automobiles for the state's high school driver education program. In addition, a grant of \$50,000 for scholarships was made to Michigan State University to assist driver education teachers complete advanced training.
Sixty Michigan high schools participated in a state-wide series of television programs in the cause of driver education. Another long-term competitive match between two teams of high school students who had completed driver education. Each program consisted of: knowledge of traffic laws; ability to determine responsibility. Weber stated that the establishing of safety councils in many Michigan communities would be a primary project, since local activity is the key to reducing the needless loss of human life and the destruction of property on our highways.

**National County
Officials Assn.
Gets Ford Grant**

A five year grant of \$100,000 has been awarded to the National Association of County Officials by the Ford Foundation. It has been announced by Mark S. Johnson, president of NACO.
The grant will be administered by the association's newly-created educational corporation Local Government Education and Research Inc., Johnson said.
The Ford Foundation funds will be used "to help provide leadership in assisting urban counties better to discharge their metropolitan area responsibilities; to help strengthen the service programs of state associations of county officials; to establish a central clearinghouse for data on county government; to improve the quality of publications in the field of county government; to conduct research and disseminate information on county problems; and to help raise the level of annual conference programs of the National Association of County Officials," the Ford Foundation stated.
Commenting on the temporary grant, Johnson pointed out, "In the past decade we have turned increasingly to the county as the administrative unit for a host of governmental functions. This is especially true of our rapidly expanding urban areas, beset with a host of problems related to the mushrooming population. In rural areas, also, the counties responsibilities are increasing."
"National leadership is needed to help prepare counties to meet their responsibilities. With the assistance of this grant we are confident that the National Association of County Officials can provide this leadership."

NACO is the national association which represents elected and appointed county officials in 47 states. In May of 1957, the 22 year old association was reorganized and hired its first full time Executive Director. In addition to its member state associations in 43 states, NACO has three functional affiliates: the National Association of County Engineers; the National Association of County Clerks and Records; and the National Association of County Treasurers and Finance Officers. General Offices are maintained at 1721 De Sales Street, N.W., Washington 6, D.C.

LIBRARY**

New books added to the Farmington City and Township Library recently include:
Camus, Albert . . . "The Fall" (Awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature-1957 and translated from the French by Justin O'Brien). A brilliant, fictional French lawyer's examination of the modern conscience, done by recounting his personal recollections of war and peace, with the conclusion that no man is innocent and no man may therefore judge others from the standpoint of righteousness.
DeFolney, Peter—"The Clap of Silent Thunder." This Don Quixote novel has modern Andalusia as its setting. Its hero, Tim Benhurst, is a fat, fifty-ish, rich, and brilliant, is attended by his chauffeur-friend who rescues him from all his middle aged escapades, indiscretions, and foolishness. There is also romance between Benhurst's lovely daughter, Antonia, (who turns out not to be his daughter) and the penniless Pepito. This book is sheer amusement, as are the following two.

Kerr . . . "Please Don't Eat the Daisies" and Linkletter—"Kids Say the Darndest Things."
Spring, Howard—"Time and the Daisies." Another long, crowded chronicle of London and England, by a generous novelist, which follows the complicated fortunes of several families from 1912 to the eve of World War II. As in Howard Spring's previous novel, "The Houses in Between," his characters include the young, the old, the rich, the poor, the humble, and the arrogant, with the inter-twining of other lives. As one of the characters, Septimus Pardage, says "this

is little but the tale of friendliness asking for it and getting it in the neck and sometimes being allowed to escape the consequences of their folly."
Swarthout, Glendon—"They Came to Cordura." A novel by the author of Willow Run has a dual theme. The more obvious is an authentic and authoritative account of the U.S. Army's punitive expedition into Mexico in 1916 against Mexican's famous bandit and revolutionist, Pancho Villa. Equally important is the theme of human behavior under stress and the conflict between courage and cowardice.

Did you realize that 90 percent of the prescriptions taken to the pharmacist today could not have been filled in 1937? 20 non-technical books describing the struggle of scientific men against disease and their dramatic successes and discouraging failures are: Donald Cooley's "The Science Book of Wonder Drugs" and A. D. Barron's "Man Against Germs."

Davis, Wesley Ford—"The Time of the Panther." A wise, tender, humorous, and earthy story steeped in the love of life and nature. The setting is the country side of Marguerite Kinnam Rawlings in the 1920's. All of the action takes place during Tom Jackson's "double barreled dilly of a summer" or, his 14th summer, and deals with his progress toward man's estate.

Guarechi, Giovanni—"Don Camillo takes the devil by the tail." More skirmishes of Don Camillo, the irascible parish priest of The Little World of Don Camillo, and his equally tempestuous opponent, Peppone, the Communist Mayor of the "Devil's Party."

The highlights on the mystery shelf include: Gardner, Earl Stanley—"The Case of the Long Legged Models." Proctor, Maurice—"The Midnight Plumber." Queen, Ellery—"The Finishing Stroke."
