**Films Beat Book 'Larin'**

"Teachers at the Ten Mile school know that the eye is much quicker than the ear in learning." Elementary art consultant Robert Benjamin said.

All during the year these teachers have taken advantage of every opportunity to supplement regular classroom instruction with a constant flow of 16mm films arriving from sources such as the University of Michigan each week. These films plus other visual aids such as 8mm movies, film strips, opaque projector material, and colored slides have afforded considerable enrichment of the program, he said.

Very unexpectedly, Kodachrome story slides have also been seen at the school. Recently Dr. Gordon Northrup, minister of the First Baptist Church in Farmington, (an anthropologist and lecturer) put on an excellent story show for the students of Lloyd Walker's sixth grade.

This subject matter was comprehensively based on a tour of Mexico, Haiti, Cuba, and Jamaica. This travelsogue effectively supplemented current events which these students had currently studying in the Junior Scholastic magazine to which they subscribe. A lively discussion period followed the viewing of the slides.
