

# Farmington Wins Track Laurels; Co-Champs in Baseball

## Falcons Win Conference Track Title; Cawley Stars

Farmington won the 1958 Inter-Lakes Conference Track title, Wednesday, May 21 by compiling 133½ points.

Running on their own track, F.H.S. thinclads set four out of the six records that were broken.

Rex Cawley set records

in the high and low hurdles and

in the high jump. Mike Agee

set the broad jump record and

Jim Marsh tied the 880 yard run.

The 880 yard team, composed

of Mike Agee, Tom Grimshaw,

Dave Catherman, and

Rex Cawley, set records

in the high and low hurdles and

in the high jump. Mike Agee

won the 100 yard dash and

the 100 low hurdles.

Ed Felton placed fourth in the

100 low hurdles, fifth in the

100 broad jump, and second in

the 100 yard dash.

This was the first time Farmington has won the league champion-

ship since 1947.
