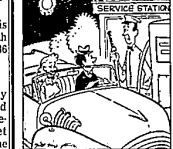
BEVERLY HAMPTON

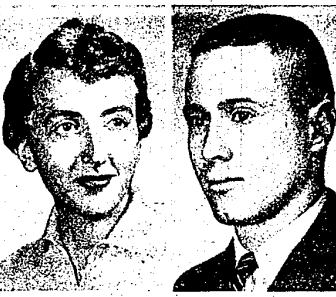
