Objectives of Boys Program

The objectives of Farmington Baseball for Boys as spelled out in the constitution are:

(a) The objective of the "FARMINGTON BASEBALL FOR BOYS" organization shall be to implant firmly in the boys of the community the ideals of good sportsmanship, honesty, loyalty, courage and reverence, so that they may be finer, stronger and happier boys and will grow to be good, clean, healthy men.

(b) The objective will be achieved by providing supervised competitive baseball games. The supervisors shall bear in mind that the attainment of exceptional athletic skill or the winning of games is secondary, and the moulding of future men of prime importance.
