Rules Govern Both Boys and Adults Participating

The following rules govern membership for both adults working in a supervisory capacity and boys participating, as spelled out in the Baseball for Boys constitution:

(a) Any boy meeting the requirements as to age as set forth in the rules of Little League Baseball, Inc. or Babe Ruth League, Inc., shall be eli-

gible to compete for participation. In addition, all participants must reside in the area. Unusual circumstances may be covered as an exception to the rule at the discretion of Management Personnel.

(b) Any adult having an active interest in the FARMINGTON BASEBALL FOR BOYS

organization shall be considered an adult member. This is especially true of the Women's Auxiliary organization which will have an organizational structure of its own.

(c) Management Personnel shall upon evidence of the misconduct of any boy, notify the manager of the team of which

the boy is a member within twenty-four hours of the act. Said manager shall appear in the capacity of an advisor with the boy before a duly appointed committee of Management Personnel, which shall have full power to suspend or revoke each boy's right to future participation.
