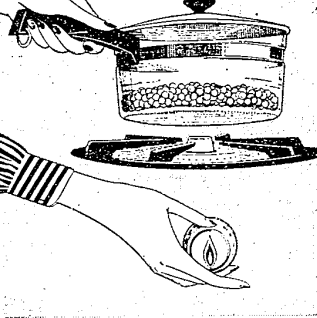

C-D Groups See 2 Pictures

At a regular meeting of the Township Civil Defense organization held Tuesday, July 1, at the Fire Station, two C-D pictures were shown. "Flash of Darkness portrayed a theoretical attack on our major cities, and the role of Civil Defense in preventing total human destruction! The story was woven around a doctor faced with having to decide who lives and who dies supplies run out in a first aid station. The other picture was "Rehearsal for Disaster," produced by the American Trucking Ass'n in cooperation with the U.S. Army. It showed the necessity of organized groups such as the trucking association, Red Cross and C-D working together in an emergency. Auxiliary police under Deputy Chief Russ Conway were present in full uniform, together with Sgt. Sibal of the state police.

New Procedure for Assessment Paving

The township board has set up paving special assessment rolls for Slaman Acres subdivision, and established extended rules for new special assessment paving plans. In the past Oakland county did the engineering for such paving projects, but will no longer do this. As the engineering must be done before assessment figures can be established, a private engineer must be retained. They will do the first engineering for 3 per cent of total cost, then another 2 1/2 per cent for inspection after the bids are sold. To follow this procedure some one must guarantee the first 3 per cent, in case enough original petitioners withdrew to kill the project. The township board decided last Tuesday that 70 per cent of the footage had petitioned it would make the guarantee. This is 5 per cent more than 65 per cent required. Paving petitions for Greenleaf subdivision were also presented, with names all checked and the required 70 per cent. The board approved the project under its new rule.

Discouraging Peddling

A request to the township board for permission to sell fruit and vegetables from a stand on Northwestern Highway has been made by a Walled Lake man. The board last Tuesday expressed a desire to discourage this, especially by the use of a permit, and will notify him of the extensive regulations which must be met before a permit could be issued.

Dump Problems in Twp. Face Board

Supervisor Frank Stephenson told the township board last Tuesday he had ordered Walter Wolfe to clean up a dump on his land within two weeks. Garbage is being hauled in from the dump, and dumped on off the Wolfe land on Farmington Road near 13 Mile, and the garbage is supposed to be hauled to these holes later. The board has talked several times about stricter enforcement on dumping of all kinds in the township.

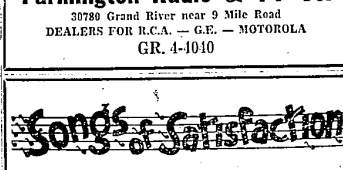
