PARKING AT REAR OF STORE

P. O. Will Have Ample Stamps At New Rates

Postmaster Henry Trombley said today he expects plenty of stamps and post cards to be on hand for sale August 1, to meet new postage rates which become effective then.

Large additional supplies of the regular 4 cent stamp, bearing the likeness of Abraham Lincoln, are being received here to meet the new first-class letter rate of 4 cents an ounce. In addition, issues of special stamps and commemorative stamps will be available at the local post office in 4 cent denominations.

A new "Champion of Liberty" stamp, honoring Simon Bolivar, the late great South American liberator, will be on sale at the local post office on July 23. In addition, issues of 3 cent and 8 cent denominations. (The 8 cent stamp is used in international mail).

Adequate supplies also are expected in other stamp denominations and envelopes, including new 7 cent air mail stamps, 3 cent postal card, replacing the 2 cent card; 5 cent air mail postal cards replacing the 4 cent air mail postal cards; and 4 cent and 7 cent stamped envelopes to be used in place of 3 cent and 6 cent stamped envelopes.

"Picture" post cards will require 3 cent stamps for surface transportation and 5 cent stamps for airmail transportation. Ample supplies of 3 cent and 5 cent stamps are expected to meet anticipated demand for these stamps.

Old supplies of 3 and 6 cent stamps, 2 and 4 cent postal cards and 3 and 6 cent envelopes may be used after August 1, by adding an ordinary penny stamp to these.

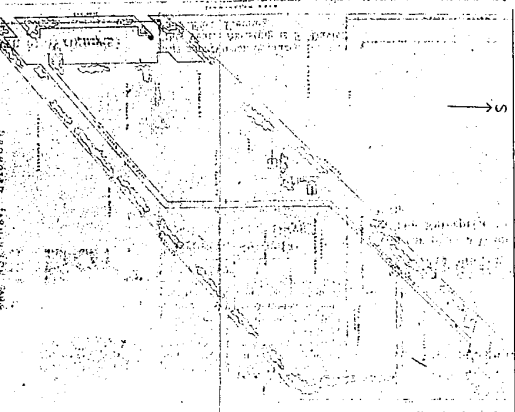

taking." Another friend, Dr. John Wright said Aiken lost 3,000 pounds, a huge sum then. Drs. Wright and Miller, popular ministers, were asked by Congress to examine the Bible when Aiken was finished. They prepared a statement saying printing was done "at the evident risk of his private fortune." Congress therefore recommended "this edition of the Bible to the inhabitants of the United States, and hereby authorize him to publish this recommendation in the manner he shall think proper."

Aiken thought it "proper" to print this recommendation and include it in the Bible. Church groups pushed the sale of the Bible and charitable groups gave copies to the needy. Doubtless this "easy come, easy go" system contributed to the scarcity of the Bible today. But whatever the reason, time has made this little printer's masterpiece a rare item.

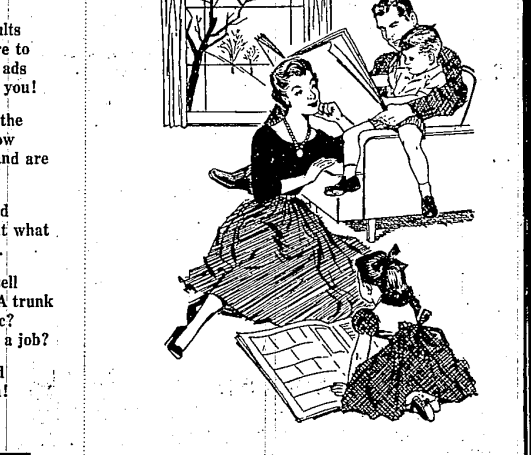
