LEAGUE OF SUBDIVISION ASSOCIATIONS

Neighbors, our League Board of Directors held a meeting on July 21st and decided on the preparation of a preliminary report on the Farmington Woods subdivision. There are many neighbors asking questions on matters where information is presently available. This report will not cover the big question, namely taxes, since more investigation is required, but it will cover many questions of the recent annexation and incorporation history of Farmington Township. The report will be mailed to the residents of member subdivisions. Our Secretary, Vernie Beals, reports that the League's mailing list currently contains 1,266 or families. Most member associations have submitted the names and addresses of all residents regardless of whether they are currently association dues payers. Only one association has still to add the names of new families moving in.

There won't be a mass-mail League report on the candidates in the August 5th Primary election. The Board of Directors felt that the offices on the ballot did not concern local affairs to the same extent as local township and school elections. Besides, there are other citizen committees organized on a county-wide basis which do this work.
