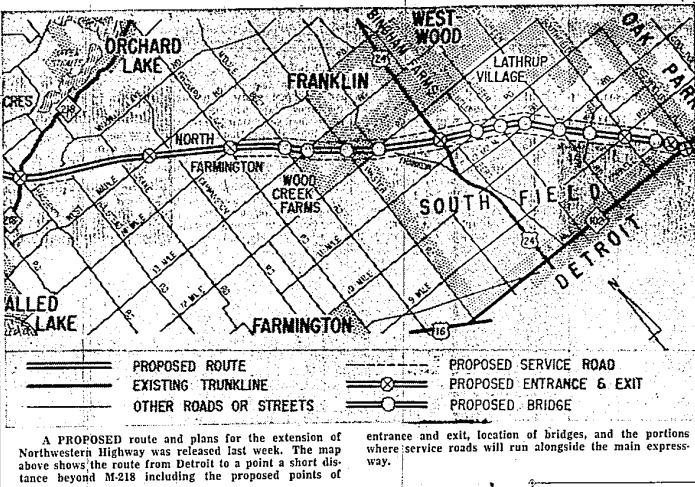

Proposed Northwestern X-way Route Hearing Set August 11

A PROPOSED route and plans for the extension of Northwestern Highway was released last week. The map above shows the route from Detroit to a point a short distance beyond M-218 including the proposed points of entrance and exit, location of bridges, and the portions where service roads will run alongside the main expressway.

The existing Northwestern Highway will be used and an additional 114 feet will be purchased along this section. From Eight Mile road to Orchard Lake road, to provide for possible future widening. The design calls for two 36-foot-wide concrete pavements for a six-lane facility to be separated by a 15-foot-wide curb of median. Steel beam guard rails will divide the traffic lanes. The existing Northwestern will become a one-way service road for traffic traveling in a southeasterly direction and a new one-way northward service road will be constructed from Eight Mile road to Orchard Lake road to handle traffic out-bound from Detroit.

From Orchard Lake road northwesterly to M-59, it is planned to build a surface facility on a 250-foot-wide right of way with 24-foot-wide concrete pavement separated by a 70-foot-wide median. Future expansion to six-lane could be achieved by widening the inside lanes when traffic volumes warrant it.

Both the existing section of Northwestern and the extension will be of limited access design. There will be 30 bridges and nine interchanges along this 23.4-mile route. The bridges will be at the following roads from Eight Mile to M-218 as shown on the map: Eight Mile, Cornell, Southfield, Westwood, Vernor, Exeter, 10 Mile, 10 1/2 Mile, 11 Mile, Telegraph, Franklin, 12 Mile, Inkster, 13 Mile, Middlebelt, 14 Mile, Orchard Lake, Maple, M-218, Haggerty highway.

Other bridges would be located at the Rouge river and the Grand Trunk Western railroad. The nine interchanges are planned at 9 Mile and Southfield roads, Telegraph, 14 Mile, Orchard Lake, Maple, Haggerty highway, M-218, Commerce road and M-59.

The following service roads are planned: From Southfield to Orchard Lake road on the east side of the expressway.

From Nottingham Knoll to 14 Mile road on the east side; from the Ford road service connection to Orchard Lake road on the west side; from Halsted road to Walnut Lake road on the west side; from Richardson road to Newton road on the east side; from Commerce road to Carroll Lake road on the north side; from Wise road to Rouge Lake road on the north side; from Cornwell road to 8 1/2 Mile road on both sides of the expressway.

All other local roads and streets will be closed or fenced. A public hearing is required in the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads on all highway construction by-passing or going through communities when federal aid (funds are to be used in the construction.
