**Charged With Tax Evasion**

John N. Anhut, 75, of Detroit, owner of Eatsford Inn here as well as two more hotels and other properties, has been charged with evading more than \$27,000 in federal income taxes. He has been released on \$5,000 personal bond.

The warrant in the present case charges that Anhut reported a 1951 income of \$7,660 when the income actually was \$48,533. George E. Woods, assistant U.S. attorney, said that from 1951 through 1954 Anhut reported a total income of \$14,857 but actually received \$50,884, evading \$27,000 in income taxes.

Joseph A. Moynihan, Jr., Anhut's attorney, said that books and records have been turned over to the government and that all taxes due have been paid.
