LEAGUE OF SUBDIVISION ASSOCIATIONS NOTES

Neighbors, our League Board of directors finally reached a new policy decision August 4th on the biggest dilemma facing the League - how the League can help member associations take a stand without having the League itself take a stand.

This policy, or any other policy, may be overruled by the Assembly of Delegates, because it has ultimate responsibility for the determination of League policies. The Assembly will meet next September 13th.

THE REASON given for not circulating League petitions was that such petitions would be considered a hybrid petition-questionnaire and hence a hindrance to the strength of stands which may wish to take. Or if two petitions, a pro and a con petition, were circulated, there would be a waste of printing and money on many issues where only one side of an issue had any chance of gaining support.

Under the new policy, the fate of the pro-con League petitions which were being prepared depends on whether a member association requests their circulation. The petitions concerned highway speed limits, the superhighway and gravel and dump pits and are not really expected to die on the vine.

HOWEVER, no petition will receive League endorsement nor will any petition receive League condemnation. Further, upon request the League will help draft a petition for a member association where possible. The League will attach to petitions being circulated a summary of all of the pro's and all of the con's, in an unbiased manner as possible, as required by our League Constitution.
