**Two From St. Paul's Lutheran To Attend District Convention**

The Rev. W. F. Rutkowski, pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Middlebelt and Eight Mile, and M. Phillips, elected delegate of the congregation, will represent St. Paul's Lutheran Church at the 77th convention of the Michigan District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod meeting in Kalamazoo from Sunday evening, August 17 through Thursday, August 22. The District includes 147 churches from all parts of the Lower Peninsula and has a total membership of nearly 200,000 members served by 144 pastors and missionaries. The Michigan District is one of 34 Districts of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, largest single Synod of the Lutheran denomination in North America.

Session of this year's district convention will be held in the auditorium of the Student Activities Building of Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo, opening with a Communion Service under the auspices of Zion Lutheran Church of Kalamazoo, the Rev. Louis W. Grother, pastor. The Rev. Arnold H. Grumm, D. D. of St. Louis, Mo., first vice-president of the national body will represent the national president, the Rev. John W. Beinhorn, D.D., at all sessions and will deliver the sermon at the opening Communion Service. Each business session of the convention will be opened with a devotion conducted by the Rev. E. H. Buchheimer of Our Savior Lutheran Church, Detroit, Convention Chaplain.

The Rev. W. Harry Krueger of Traverser City, District President elected last August in Ann Arbor, will preside at all business sessions of the convention. Major items of business to come before this convention will include the proposal to establish a new preparatory college in the Detroit area; the election of delegates to this district to the national convention to be held in the summer of 1959 in San Francisco; and some officials anticipate to build a central office for the District.
