Labor Day Week End Big Challenge

Motorists will face a real challenge on Michigan highways over the Labor Day holiday to reduce the death toll under the record low of 13 fatalities last year.

The death tolls are computed from 8 p.m. Friday to midnight Monday, a period of 78 hours. Last year the average was one death every six hours. During the five years previous to this, a death average was one every three hours, the lowest being 14 in 1951 and the highest in 1952 and 1953 with 22 each year.

The goal of the Michigan State Police is to have the lowest toll ever occurred.

Again an intensified patrol will be in effect from noon Friday, Aug. 29, to midnight Monday, Sept. 1. All pass days will be cancelled and more than a thousand state police on duty. Traffic patrols will work 10 hour shifts, assisted by 129 National Guardsmen. Sheriffs will have 96 Guardsmen.
