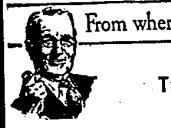


The Old Timer

Home Shelter Plan Available
 Donald D. Pullen, secretary of the Farmington Chamber of Commerce, announces he has been advised of the availability of bulletins on the construction of home shelters.

Issued by the Michigan Office of Civil Defense, the bulletin is a guide for home owners, engineers, contractors and architects in planning family shelters against wartime levels of radioactive fallout. The shelters would provide protection against tornadoes as well.

Diagrams of the construction of underground, above ground and basement shelters, as well as listing supplies and equipment that a family should have on hand in such a shelter. While the shelters are designed for new construction, with some modification they could be adapted to existing structures.

The bulletin describes radioactive fallout and points out the danger from radiation that might require a family to remain in shelters for two weeks or more. However, in other areas, radiation levels might permit families to leave the shelters immediately or permanently after two or three days.

Prepared by the Office of Defense and Civilian Mobilization, the free bulletin is available by contacting the local Civil Defense office, the Chamber of Commerce or the Michigan Office of Civil Defense, 119 W. Washenau, Lansing.
