LEAGUE OF SUBDIVISION ASSOCIATIONS SNOOZES

Neighbors, we've made a terrible mistake. It isn't Jack Dew who is chairman of the League of Subdivision Associations... The package which was ratified by the member associations was probably the only package which would have been ratified for Monday evening, September 22, at 7:30. It will be held at Jack Dew's home in Farmington Hills. The roads are a bit winding in there, so you had better follow Jack for directions. Jack will print a map on the post-card notes. On the agenda is the current assignment by the League to conduct a study of the effect on scenic beauty when sewer lines are constructed down our valleys. The committee has proposed two assignments in the Upper Box; namely, conservation of trees, when between 12 and 15 mile roads, and finding a contractor for a mass-planting arrangement for a tree suitable to this area. THE COMMITTEE on Youth Safety and Activities met on Friday, September 5, at the home of Gerry Kovendall in West Franklin. Estate assignments were passed out to carry out the committee's current task of preparing a report on how a subdivision association might assist in getting traffic control signs for its subdivision roads. Gerry herself is going to contact the Oakland County Road Commission, Tom Garwood of Crestview and Jerry Haviland of Kendallwood are going to contact the Kendallwood Association for their experience in obtaining the speed-limit type of sign. Dick Thomas is going to contact the Glen Orchard Civic Association for their experience in obtaining the slow-children type of sign. They have hopes of gathering the information and writing the report by the time of the next meeting which will be in early October. Some confusion still exists on the provision in our League Constitution which prohibits the member from taking a stand on an issue but at the same time requires that the League help individuals and member associations to take stands. From all the way back to the League Board, the leaders of the League movement have continually stressed the importance of the League not taking stands and the necessity that strong

which noxious weeds are found growing. Such notice shall contain methods of treating and eradicating such noxious weeds and a summary of the provisions of this section. Failure of the Supervisor to give such notice shall constitute a defense in any action to enforce the payment of any taxes levied under the provisions of this ordinance. In case any such owner, agent or occupant shall be found to destroy such noxious weeds or cause the same to be destroyed, after ten days notice as provided herein, then the supervisor or such other agent authorized by the supervisor or governing body of the Township may enter upon such subdivided lands and remove such noxious weeds and equipment by cutting with or without machinery which will not damage the property or the sides of the road thereon, any such weeds, and all expenses incurred in such destruction shall be paid by the owner or owner's agent. The Township shall have the right to remove such noxious weeds in the manner prescribed by the general laws of the state providing for the removal of such noxious weeds. Any owner who shall refuse to destroy such noxious weeds as provided herein shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00, said fine when collected shall be paid to the Supervisor and shall become a part of the "noxious weed control fund" of the Township. Nothing in this ordinance shall apply to weeds in fields devoted to growing any small grain, or the owner or owner's agent, as amended.
Section 2. Noxious weeds are defined as follows:
Section 3. This ordinance shall be effective when adopted by the Township and when so adopted after thirty (30) days of notice as provided herein, publication of said ordinance.

REVISED ORDINANCE

CONTROL AND ERADICATION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS IN SUBDIVIDED LANDS
This ordinance is passed in pursuance of the authority granted the Township of Farmington by Section 4 of Act 362 of the Public Acts of 1941 as amended.
An ordinance for the purpose of controlling and eradicating certain noxious weeds in subdivided lands within Farmington Township, to have in lieu of expenses incurred in enforcement and grading such weeds and to provide penalties for violation thereof.
It is hereby ordained by the Board of Farmington Township:
Section 1. It shall be the duty of all owners of any subdivided land and in any subdivision in which buildings have been erected on sixty per cent (60%) of the lots included in that subdivision on which noxious weeds are found growing, to destroy the same before they reach a seed bearing stage and to prevent such weeds from perpetuating themselves. If any owner of such weeds becoming a detriment to public health. The supervisor shall so notify by certified mail with return receipt requested, the owner, agent, or occupant of any subdivided lands on mentioned subdivided lands on
