C-D Plans for Year Are Told

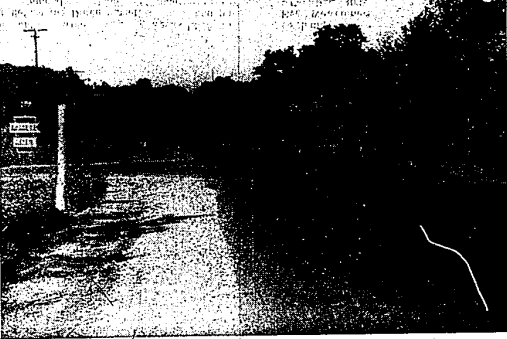
A new assistant director for the Township Civil Defense organization was named Tuesday night, and plans for the coming year's activities discussed in detail by officers and members.
